

# Risk Management Information implementation timeline announced



RMI is the Department of the Navy's sole safety and mishap reporting system, it replaces a number of legacy reporting systems to include web-enabled safety systems, enterprise safety application management system, various shipyard databases and other stand-alone systems.

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Per ALNAV 012/26, RMI implementation is taking a three-phased approach: Phase I took effect Jan.1, 2026, when RMI reached initial operational capability with the following modules transitioned: Investigation, Inspection, Occupational Safety and Health Administration Event Reporting, Hazard Abatement, Mishap Prevention and Hazard Abatement Feature, Unsafe/Unhealthful, Confined Space, Job Hazard Analysis, Motorcycle Safety Program and Training. Phase II became effective March 1, when two additional modules were migrated: Manage Personnel and Medical Surveillance. Phase III takes effect May 1, 2026, when full operational capability is reached with the last few modules transitioned: Respiratory Program Management and High Risk Training.

RMI streamlined incident reporting (SIR) was released throughout the DON in 2020 to promote the Navy's digital transformation. RMI must be used for reporting, recording and analyzing all mishaps, hazards (including near misses), and incidents, per OPNAV M-5102.1. RMI is Department of War Common Access Card-enabled, and access links are available on the Naval Safety Command website at <https://navalsafetycommand.navy.mil/>.

After May 1, 2026, input of safety related information into any systems other than RMI is prohibited. Safety related information includes injuries and illnesses, which are already required, as well as safety program management information, such as inspections, hazards from inspections, medical surveillance, motorcycle rider data and other information required by OPNAV M-5100.23 that has been maintained in other systems in the past.

## RMI Courses Available

To support the effective implementation of RMI, targeted training courses are offered. These online courses are designed for military and civilian personnel and cover various aspects of the RMI system.

These comprehensive RMI courses are available entirely online, offering interactive sessions and resulting in a completion certificate for your Fleet Training Management and Planning System (FLTMPS) training jacket. With courses starting at various times, find a time that best fits your schedule and take advantage of this valuable training opportunity.

Dates and times of training courses are released quarterly and can be found at <https://navalsafetycommand.navy.mil/Learning/NAVSAFENVTRACEN/RMI-Training/>. All sessions are stand-alone – you must register for each topic separately.

**How to Enroll:** To enroll in RMI training, select a course from the course schedule found above and complete the registration form with your information. After registering, you will receive a confirmation email with course access details and links, followed by a reminder email four days before your course begins. All courses are delivered online through Adobe Connect using the link provided in your confirmation email. At the end of training, complete the End-of-Course Survey to receive your certificate and download it immediately, as certificates are only available for 15 minutes after the session ends and replacements are not issued. Training completion will be uploaded to FLTMPS within four weeks and you must be registered for the course to receive official credit in your training jacket.

Available RMI courses equip you with the knowledge and skills needed to maintain data accuracy and integrity within the system. We strongly encourage you to explore the catalog and enroll in the courses that will best enable you to contribute to reliable risk management reporting and analysis.
